Los Angeles is a diverse and densely populated city. The traffic is really bad 100% of the time. My mission covered the L.A. Area, which included Hollywood, down-town, and Compton. It was an amazing experience to be there. I learned that God and Jesus Christ love all these children. One experience I had was with a family from Mexico. They had an aunt and uncle in Mexico who were members of the church. They attended an LDS ward when they visited them in Mexico, but were only there for two months so did not follow up. Every other appointment that morning cancelled and when we went to the class where they taught English no one showed up. We returned home to discover the entire apartment was flooded. We cleaned up the mess and went to bed. The only thing that helped was reading Alma 26:27 and realizing that the next day would be better. We need to follow the living prophet, read the Book of Mormon and live the principles of the gospel every day, every day, every day!
